Katie Reisner is a lawyer and policy expert in immigration and refugee law and policy. She currently serves as Senior Policy Advisor to NYC Mayor Bill de Blasio's Commissioner for Immigrant Affairs. Before this, Katie worked in Washington in the Obama Administration, as a Counselor to the Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Homeland Security, focusing on immigration and refugee policy, and then as a Legislative Counsel to Senator Kamala Harris.



Jeremy Robbins is the Executive Director of the New American Economy, a bipartisan coalition of more than 500 CEOs and mayors making the economic case for immigration reform. Jeremy previously worked as a policy advisor and special counsel in the Office of New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg, a judicial law clerk to the Honorable Robert Sack of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, a Robert L. Bernstein International Human Rights Fellow working on prisoner's rights issues in

Argentina, and a litigation associate at WilmerHale in Boston.



John A. Gronbeck-Tedesco is Associate Professor and Convener of American Studies at Ramapo College of New Jersey. His writing has appeared in *American Quarterly*, *Journal of Latin American Studies*, *Journal of American Studies*, *Studies in Latin American Popular Culture*, and numerous web publications. He is the author of the book, *Cuba, the United States, and Cultures of the Transnational Left, 1930-1975* (Cambridge University Press, 2015) and co-editor of *Screening Images of American Masculinity in the Age of Postfeminism* (Lexington Books, 2015). He is currently

working on a book about Cuban refugees.
